Autism Spectrum Disorders in Infants and Toddlers: Integrating Research and Experience to Plan Best Practice Interventions

This one-day workshop will use video-based cases to bootstrap interactive discussion regarding the early identification and treatment of young children with an Autism Spectrum Disorder. Evidence-based assessment and intervention principles will be integrated with the latest research on early identification and intervention. The workshop will be organized around 3 developmental periods: Infancy, toddlerhood and preschool. Participants are invited to bring challenging cases for discussion and problem solving.

Facilitator Bio – Shelley Mitchell, SLP

Shelley Mitchell has extensive experience in school, health and hospital settings since qualifying as a Speech-Language Pathologist at the University of Alberta in 1992. Working on a multi-disciplinary team at the Child Development Centre at the Hospital for Sick Children since 1999 and subsequently at Bloorview Kids Rehab, has enhanced both her experience and her special interest in autism and related disorders. She has collaborated on several research projects at the Autism Research Unit at Sick Kids including the Siblings of Children with Autism and the Genetics of Autism projects. Miss. Mitchell has presented nationally and internationally on the assessment and treatment of children with autism at conferences and workshops in locations such as Toronto, Chicago, Greece, China and Thailand. She is currently pursuing her PhD in Speech-Language Pathology at the University of Toronto.
